Abdul Rahman Omar (aro), obtained his degree in Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) from Universiti Pertanian Malaysia, currently known as Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM), Malaysia in 1991. He graduated with the highest distinction and was awarded the Chancellor Gold Medal award. In 1992, he was offered a post as a tutor in the field of immunology in the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine (FVM), UPM and went to Cornell University, the USA to complete his PhD in Cellular Immunology. Upon completion of his

PhD in 1997, he joined the FVM, UPM as a lecturer and was promoted to Professor of Immunology and Infectious Diseases in 2008. He was also the Deputy Director of Institute Bioscience (IBS) at UPM from 2006 until 2011. In June 2011, he was promoted as the Director of IBS. Presently, IBS is the Centre of Excellence in Animal Vaccines and Therapeutics recognized by Ministry of Higher Education, Government of Malaysia. His research interest is in using biotechnology and immunogenomics approaches in the development of diagnostics, vaccines, and therapeutics against poultry diseases. He has published more than 150 journal papers, has several patents, book chapters, national and international awards. He is also one of the regional advisors of Global Alliance for Research on Avian Diseases, an international consortium based at the Pirbright Institute, UK. He has completed 7 research projects, and has supervised and graduated many postgraduate and undergraduate students. He was awarded the Top Research Scientist of Malaysia, by the Academy of Science Malaysia. Currently he is the Chairman of Institutional Biosafety Committee at UPM and President of World Veterinary Poultry Association Malaysia.
